



Perinatal Oral Health Assessment

To be administered during the initial appointment

ADVISE PREGNANT WOMEN ABOUT ORAL HEALTH CARE

1. Encourage daily oral hygiene, healthy foods and prenatal classes.
2. Recommend appointment of dental care.
3. Reassure that oral health care is safe. Including dental cleanings, x-rays, pain medication as necessary and local anesthesia.

TOOTH DECAY/DENTAL CARIES

Demineralization and loss of substance of the hard tissues of the teeth, leading to continued destruction of enamel and dentin, and cavitation of the tooth.

VISUAL INDICATORS OF CARIES INCLUDE:

- White spots on clean, dry, teeth
- Yellow tinge due to erosion of enamel and exposure of underlying dentin
- Black/brown areas, especially along pits and grooves
- Yellow/orange/tan/light brown appearance of roots

DENTAL ABSCESS

Localized accumulation of purulent material in oral tissues, typically originating from a bacterial infection in the soft pulp of tooth. Abscesses can affect the root of the tooth or the gums.

SIGNS INCLUDE:

- Severe, persistent, throbbing toothache
- Sensitivity to hot and cold temperatures
- Sensitivity when chewing or biting
- Fever
- Swelling of face or cheek
- Redness or swelling of gums
- Swelling of lymph nodes
- Bitter taste in mouth
- Foul smell
- Erythematous nodule on gums
- Open, draining lesion or sinus on gum
